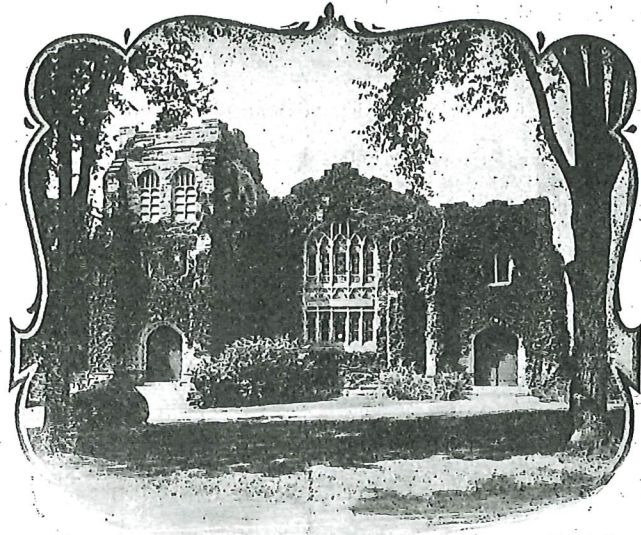

D., as President of the College of Wooster was endorsed and support of his administration was pledged by unanimous and enthusiastic vote. The report on Evangelism aroused much interest. The Rev. PROPOSED CONSTITUTION OF THE ANNE HART AUXILIARY

(Presented to the members January 7th, 1944, to be voted upon February 3, 1944)

*Submitted, with indicated corrections, unanimously adopted, " " "*

Preamble

When, in the course of human events, it becomes evident that, owing to advanced age, a Guild has outgrown its shell, and it is necessary for the members of one chapter to dissolve the ecclesiastical bands which have connected them with others, and to assume, among the powers of the Church, the separate and equal station to which their energies and interests entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of Presbyterian womankind requires that they should declare the purposes which impel them to reorganization.

We, the young women of the group heretofore known as The Harriet Allyn Chapter of Westminster Guild, in order to preserve our entity as a society, to establish a new relationship among church organizations, to insure congregational tranquillity, to provide for our missionary interests at home and abroad, and to secure the blessings of Christian service to ourselves and our successors, do ordain and establish this constitution in the year A. D. 1925.

Article I. Name.

Desiring to perpetuate the memory of a faithful member, a loyal officer, and a loved friend, the society has ordered the adoption of the name, "The Anne Hart Auxiliary" of Westminster Presbyterian Church, Wooster, Ohio. *Ord Nov 2, 1924*

Article II. Purpose.

The purpose of this Auxiliary shall be to enlist the women of Westminster Church and community in an endeavor to promote a more intelligent interest in Christian missionary work throughout the world, more particularly that carried on under the supervision of that organization whose official title is "The Presbyterian Church in the United States of America"; to labor for the upbuilding of the kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, both at home and abroad; to foster that spirit of fellowship which is at once an asset to the Church, and the basis of an enduring friendship among the individual members of the Auxiliary.

Article III. Status.

The Auxiliary shall be understood to be allied with, but in no wise subsidiary to, the Women's Missionary Society of Westminster Presbyterian Church, and, like that organization, working under the direction of the Mission Boards of the Presbyterian Church U.S.A., and their properly constituted representatives.

Article IV. Membership.

Section 1. Membership shall be open to any woman whose interests and ideals are in accord with the purposes and activities of this Auxiliary.

Section 2. Reception of Members. Members may be formally received at any regular meeting after they have signified their desire to enter the fellowship of this group. A recognition ceremony shall be conducted by the President, to whom the Membership Secretary shall present the new members.

Section 3. Withdrawal from Membership. Notice of withdrawal from active membership should be presented by the withdrawing member to the Membership Secretary. Whenever possible such notice should be received by the Membership Secretary before plans are made and the program printed for the new year.
